Ticket Sales

Tickets for workshops, functions, accommodation and special events are sold on a first-come, first-served basis.

All tickets for the Festival will be sold online. Visit the Festival website https://www.saquiltfest2024.co.za and place your activities and accommodation in your cart for payment processing via Tixsa-Administration charges will be added to tickets at checkout.

How to book:

- 2. Select Registration. This is compulsory.
- 3. Select Accommodation. Choose your room size, state who you want to share with and your dietary requirements. Furnish us with your car registration, should you require parking.
- 4. Book your seat at the opening Prize Giving Dinner on 4 July 2024. Not to be missed!
- 5. Book your lectures and workshops.
- 6. Book your seat at the Farewell Dinner and find out about the 2026 National Festival.

Catering

Cafeteria

A food court providing a cafeteria service with tea, coffee, light lunches and snacks will be available for day visitors. The food court is located in the courtyard adjacent to Registration. It will be open daily from Friday to Tuesday. The cafeteria does not provide evening meals.

Tea and coffee will be served in the classroom area daily for all workshop participants at 10h30 and 15h30.

- Quilters accommodated in the hostel are booked in on a bed, breakfast, lunch and dinner basis. These meals are served in the dining room.
- PLEASE NOTE that on the evenings of the two functions, dinner will only be available at the functions.
- Should you decide not to come to either or both functions, you will need to arrange for dinner off-campus, or order in through a delivery service.
- Tickets will be sold separately for the two evening functions which include dinner.

Pam Stallebrass will be at the festival selling fabrics that she designs, prints and dyes.

Her designs and colours are inspired by her travels in Africa, Mexico, South America and India.

She has been enjoying slow-stitching and will bring kits and beads to sell.

There will also be small printed and painted fabric blocks of animals and birds to add to your projects.



Accommodation

One hundred and ninety (190) beds are available in the school hostel, of which 104 are single cubicles and 43 are shared cubicles with two single beds. Accommodation reservations are made via the Festival website. To avoid disappointment please book this soon. Quilters staying in the hostel are booked in on a bed, breakfast, lunch and dinner basis (served in the dining room), except for the two Festival functions on 4 and 9 July 2024.

Vegetarian meals are available and should be selected when making your booking. Please note any other dietary requirements on the booking site.

All linen will be provided by the school. See the Festival website for accommodation details.

Hostel Parking

Limited parking is available for members accommodated in the hostel. Members requiring parking are to indicate this when booking accommodation. Parking disks will be issued to members when checking in at the hostel reception.

Hostel accommodation will be available from Thursday, 4 July until Wednesday, 10 July. Daily check-in is from 14h00, and check-out is by 10h00 on the day of departure. Everyone is requested to vacate their rooms directly after breakfast on Wednesday, 10 July 2024.

Private Accommodation

Should you wish to stay in private accommodation, make your arrangements early as Pietermaritzburg is a popular town. There are numerous places available in the vicinity of Epworth School.



Transport

Parking

Day visitors may park in the designated parking areas on the school grounds or outside the school grounds. A limited number of bays will be reserved for disabled visitors.

Airport Transport

Oribi Airport in Pietermaritzburg is 3.6 km from Epworth School. Airlink operates out of this airport. It is recommended that you travel from the airport in a group to share transport costs. Uber drivers are recommended and can be pre-booked through the Uber App.

REMEMBER: Check the car registration and driver's name before climbing into a car, and preferably share your trip with someone.


Photography

The Red Dress



Kirstie Macleod, provides an artistic platform for Arabia. women around the world, many of whom are vulnerable and live in poverty, to tell their personal stories through embroidery.

From 2009 to 2023, pieces of the Red Dress travelled the globe being continuously embroidered onto-Constructed out of 87 pieces of burgundy silk dupion, the garment has been worked on by 367 women/girls, 11 men/boys and 2 non-binary artists from 51 coun- pants. A 50% discount for school learners. tries.

All 141 commissioned embroiderers were paid for their work, and receive a portion of all ongoing exhibition fees, merchandise, and the opportunity to sell their work through the Red Dress Etsy shop. The rest of the embroidery was added by willing audience at various exhibitions and events.

Embroiderers include female refugees from Palestine, Syria and Ukraine, women seeking asylum in the UK from Iran, Iraq, China, Nigeria and Namibia, survivors of war in Kosovo, Bosnia & Herzegovina, Rwanda, and DR Congo; impoverished women in South Africa, Mexico, and Egypt; individuals in Kenya, Japan, Turkey, Jamaica, Sweden, Peru, Czech Republic, Dubai, Afghanistan, Australia, Argentina, Germany, Switzerland, Canada, Tobago, Vietnam, Estonia, USA, Russia, Pakistan, Wales, Colombia and England, students from Montenegro, Brazil, Malta, Singapore, Eritrea, Norway, Poland, Finland, Ireland, Romania and Hong Kong, The Red Dress project, conceived by British artist as well as upmarket embroidery studios in India and Saudi

About Kirstie

THE CREATOR OF THE RED DRESS project



Kirstie Macleod has worked with textiles for over 20 years, 14 of those have been focused on the Red Dress. What began as a sketch on the back of a napkin in 2009, has grown into a global collaborative project involving hundreds of people all over the world.

Growing up in various far-flung countries Kirstie's former years were saturated with contrasting culture, colour, language and experience. Trying to make sense of her journey whilst beginning to form her own sense of identity she immersed herself in drawing, painting and sewing.

Textiles were always present growing up; the women of

Kirstie's family are all skilled stitchers, knitters and makers so it was only a matter a time before she herself picked up a needle and thread. Kirstie later gained a BA in Textile Design followed by an MA in Visual Language & Performance before beginning her career as a Fine Artist living in London. The works formed a diverse portfolio comprising photography, film, painting, drawing and high impact installations involving garments.

The Red Dress began in 2009 as an investigation into identity, and a desire to connect with women from around the world, without borders and boundaries. As the years unfolded, so too did the potential of the garment to become a vehicle for expression and a platform for voices to be heard. The Red Dress has managed to access disparate communities worldwide, allowing connection and conversation between individuals who may never meet in person.

Having a quilt judged is a positive learning experience, giving one direction to grow as a quilter. You may even earn the bonus of a prize!

There is a maximum number of four entries allowed for each quilter, and the cost of each quilt entry is R200.

You will need to confirm that you have complied with all the Rules and Conditions when filling in and completing the entry form.

- a. Enter your quilt in the correct category (we won't be moving quilts).
- b. Ensure that it has a hanging sleeve at the back of the guilt.
- c. Ensure your quilt has a cloth label in the lower left corner at back of the quilt. Cover the label with a dark cloth, leaving the quilt name and quilt entry code visible.
- d. Maximum of four (4) quilts may be entered by any single person.
- e. Packaging: Each quilt must be packaged separately in a cloth bag. No plastic bags will be accepted.
- f. Your cloth packaging must have your name on the outside, the category and quilt number.
- g. Quilt entries close 24 April 2024.
- h. Quilts to be couriered to Margie Crookes to arrive with her by 1 June 2024. NO drop-off points. Address: 3299 Nguni Drive, St John's Village, Karkloof Road, Howick, 3290.

Festival Quilt Competition Jurors

Jurors are SAQG Accredited Judges; their duty is to inspect each entry and ensure that all quilts entered comply with the relevant Competition Rules and are of an acceptable standard for the SA National Quilt Competition as well as appropriate subject matter. SAQG Judging Representative, Paul Schutte, attends the judging sessions to ensure that all proceedings have been fair and done according to the competition rules.



ROSALIE DACE

Rosalie started quilting in the early 1970s while she was teaching at the Johan Carinus Art Centre in Grahamstown. As a keen embroiderer, she had become fascinated by the possibilities of fabric, so teaching, jurying and judging quilts was a natural progression over the years. She joined Grassroots Quilters' Guild and became a founder member of the coastal

branch of the South African Embroiderers' Guild, KZNQG and Fibreworks, and served as the first president of the newly-formed SAQG in 1989, becoming involved in developing programmes for training and educating our quilt teachers and judges.

She has travelled extensively both nationally and internationally to lecture, teach, exhibit, jury and judge. Her work has won several awards and has been widely published.

As a juror and judge she looks for the best of what is submitted. She is excited by work that has visual impact and is technically excellent, with evidence of the individual artist's own voice. She considers work, whether traditional or contemporary, that offers something individual in its use of colour, pattern, texture and good integrated overall composition.



MARLINE TURNER

Marline became an Accredited Quilt Judge in 2000 and since then she has judged at several quilt festivals in South Africa and internationally. She is also an Accredited SAQG Quilt Teacher. Marline is a passionate quilter and loves every aspect of quilt-making. She enjoys encouraging students and quiltmakers to strive for perfection.

Festival Quilt Competition Judges

Judges are SAQG Accredited Judges; they will provide a comment form for each quilt in the Competition (Section 1) and award prizes. The decisions and choices of the judges are final, and no queries or correspondence pertaining to the judging will be considered. SAQG Judging Representative, Paul Schutte, attends the judging sessions to ensure that all proceedings have been fair and done according to the competition rules.



ODETTE TOLKSDORF

Odette is an artist, designer and educator who has been working in the world of contemporary quiltmaking for many years. Her formal education in graphic design and art have merged wonderfully with her lifelong passion for textiles, threads, and stitching.

She teaches a variety of classes in design and contemporary quiltmaking, and has exhibited her art quilts at international quilt conferences around the world and throughout Southern Africa.

Aspects of both contemporary and traditional techniques are found in Odette's art quilts and they have been widely published around the world. See FiberArts Design Book 7, Quilt National – The Best Contemporary Quilts and A Passion for Quiltmaking by Norma Slabbert. Her work can be found on many internet sites.

Since the early 1990s Odette has been a quilt judge and curator of quilt exhibitions, which include the Houston Quilt Festival, the World Quilt and Textile Competition, and others.

Odette is a founder member of the South African Quilters Guild, the KZN Quilters Guild and Fibreworks: http://www.fibreworksart.com

Among the awards that Odette has received are a Lifetime Honorary Membership of the KZN Quilters Guild in 2007, the Pro Dedicate award from the South African Quilters Guild: https://www.quiltsouthafrica.co.za/ 2020-hall-of-fame-odette-tolksdorf, and the Grassroots Guild Chairlady's Award.

In 1995 Odette conceived the idea for, and helped to coordinate, assembly of The Peace Quilt, consisting of almost 800 flat brick-sized blocks, received from 29 countries and made into 27 quilts.

It was exhibited throughout South Africa, and at the Houston International Quilt Festival and in Europe. The Peace Quilt is now permanently displayed in the International Convention Centre in Durban and is enjoyed by people from all over the world.

Cape Town, one of the most beautiful cities in the world, is home for Odette where she now lives with her husband.

JENNY HERMANS

Jenny has been sewing and quilting since she was a teenager. She has served on the SAQG as a rep, the president from 2017-22, and is involved as a tutor and co-ordinator for the SAQG Accreditation courses, for Quilt Teachers and Quilt Judges. She has had a role in the organising committees of five of the SA National Quilt Festivals since 1988 to 2022.

Jenny is an Accredited Quilt Judge with experience in judging quilts locally, regionally, and nationally - at three SA National Quilt Festivals and in Zimbabwe. She has also served in vari-

ous capacities in many quilt competitions as a scribe, a juror and a judge, and as judging room co-ordinator. Her work has been in publications and on exhibitions and in competitions, nationally and internationally.

As a quilt judge Jenny is honoured and excited to be part of a team and strives to give fair and constructive, encouraging comments, while recognising effort and skill and rewarding quality and excellence. "I am keen to see the quiltmakers' technical skills and workmanship, their colour and design choices, and how quilters use their passion and express their 'Voices in Cloth' in works entered in the competition."

TRISH VAN ZYL

Trish van Zyl started her needlework journey at about the age of five, taught by her mother. She made her first quilt in 1983 and is an accomplished quilter, having won awards at a couple of South African National Quilt Festivals. She received accreditation by the South African Quilters' Guild in 1998 after successfully completing the Judging Certification Course. She has judged



various small group and guild challenges in Pretoria and the Gauteng area since, and was part of the judging panel for the 2002 Down to Earth National Quilt Festival in Cape Town, and for the 2006 Sands of Time National Quilt Festival in Port Elizabeth. She has since juried the South African Quilters' Guild Travelling Exhibitions: Round the Bend - A Study in Curves, with Celia de Villiers, an accomplished fibre artist, and Optical Illusions with Jenny Hearn. She was part of the jury panel for the South African Exhibition at the ninth European Patchwork Meeting in Val d' Agent in France in 2003.
